



<u>Note:</u> Skyjacker FA300, FA307, & FA500 are OEM replacements.

However, models equipped with "Scissor Style" steering found on 76-77 Ford F100 / F150 & Bronco. Must change drag link & tie rod assembly to "Straight Style" steering found on the 78-79 Ford F150 & Bronco in order to install a drop pitman arm. (See Figure # 3)

Installation:

- 1. Remove the OEM tie rod from the OEM pitman arm & lower the tie rod.
- 2. Remove the OEM nut & washer from the output shaft of the OEM steering gear box.
- 3. Using a pitman arm puller, remove the OEM pitman arm from the OEM steering gear box & install the new Skyjacker pitman arm using the OEM nut & washer.
- 4. Attach the OEM tie rod the new Skyjacker pitman arm using the OEM hardware. **Note:** If you changed styles of steering, reset the toe-in / toe-out & tighten all tie rod assembly hardware.

5. After the first 100 miles, check all hardware for the proper torque & periodically thereafter. I-PITMAN ARM
